



Killingworth

For nearly 90 years, Middlesex United Way has been working with our community to make Killingworth a great place to live and work. In the 2023-2024 Grant Cycle, we've awarded over \$260,000 to local agencies that focus on housing, education, wellness, financial stability, youth, and racial equity & inclusion.



In the past year, <u>520</u> residents of Killingworth called United Way's 2-1-1, a toll-free statewide helpline that operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. More than 52% of those calls were related to mental health and addiction.

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ALICE, an acronym for <u>A</u>sset <u>L</u>imited, <u>I</u>ncome <u>C</u>onstrained, **Employed**, represents the men and women in CT's households of all ages and races who get up each day to go to work but aren't sure if they'll be able to make ends meet. The most recent data shows that 25% of Killingworth residents are considered below the ALICE threshold.
